The following are the statements of the Sierra Madre City Council Candidates, as they will appear on the sample ballot for the April 8<sup>th</sup> election. These have been provided to us by the City Clerk. Citizens will be asked to vote for two candidates. The incumbents are John Buchanan and Mayor Enid Joffe. Challengers are Maryann McGillivray and Kevin Paschall.

### JOHN BUCHANAN

Age: 49 Occupation: Attorney

It has been my honor to serve you for four years as a Councilmember, including a term as your Mayor. In that time we have accomplished much. I led the effort that produced our life-saving paramedic program. We enhanced firefighter training, secured federal money to strengthen our water system, finished the senior housing project, forged a new partnership with our police, expanded park space, and were named an All-America City.

Financial, operational, and environmental challenges test us still. I take these challenges seriously. but face them with confidence, because I envision Sierra Madre meeting these challenges by maintaining and capitalizing on its deep sense of community and its historic and natural treasures as the foundation of a vibrant future.

Education and Qualifications: As a 36 year resident of Sierra Madre, I am committed to protect and preserve our foothill village character, our hillsides from the disfigurement and public safety dangers of inappropriate development, and secure our treasured quality of life. My record as former mayor and two-term councilwoman (serving on two HMZ committees) demonstrates this. The rewriting of the General Plan (1996) validates my commitment to slow and appropriate growth in both commercial and residential areas. I oppose developments that are contrary, and support the dictums of the community, including Measure V as voted in by the people.
